The core of your role on Sunday morning:

Imagine that you are throwing a dinner party at your house,
and as the host, you want to make your guests feel at home.
This means good preparation and the correct materials, to be sure...
but it also means that above all else, you are to be welcoming, warm & kind

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

Before Service

- Arrive around 30 minutes before worship
- Please note that the special "Greeter" nametags are gone...
(we want you to be a bit like "secret shoppers" now...
folks don't need to know it is your "job" to greet them!)
- Make sure to stand anywhere near either the front door or at the
top of the stairs (these are the two main entrances to the building).
- Please do not stand in line with the ushers – wander & mingle!
- You are a greeter because you are a warm & kind person – let that
warmth & kindness shine through you!
- Please keep an eye open for visitors and new families. Please help point
out the nursery, bathrooms, Children's Bulletins and activity bags.
- Don't forget: Every person you greet is coming seeking God in their life!
Maybe you can be their first experience of unconditional welcome!
